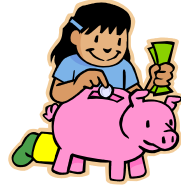


MONEY WISE

Money Wise is an age appropriate curriculum co-sponsored with the Office of the State Attorney General.

THE MONEY TRAIL (Grades 1-2)

Teaches students to identify coins and bills, to understand the value of money, and how to relate this information to the prices of goods and services.



SUPER SHOPPER (Grades 3-4)

Teaches students about managing money they receive. It also explains the importance of reading labels for product information.

YOUR CONSUMER RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES (Grades 5-6)

Provides information about how prices are determined, comparing products and prices, and consumer's responsibilities.

MARKETPLACE CHOICES (Grades 7-9)

Provides information on advertising, retailing practices, sales methods, personal finances, and choosing transportation.

BECOMING A COMPETENT CONSUMER (Grades 9-12)

Includes information on selecting and using credit, check writing and records, and resolving consumer problems.

Resources: Teacher/leader guide, videos, student workbooks, and certificates.

HIGH SCHOOL FINANCIAL PLANNING PROGRAM (Grades 9-12)

Includes basic financial planning concepts and how they apply to everyday life; teaches financial responsibility to help students avoid financial difficulties. (Credit, taxes, investments, goal setting, spending plans, etc.)
